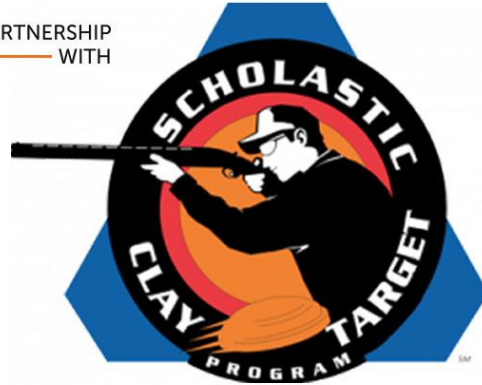

Community Member Responsibilities

Each member is responsible to follow and uphold all that is contained within this match program guide. We must be self-governing and self-policing. It is each community member's responsibility to:

- **Be Courteous** – We are a student athlete-centered group; we share and collectively benefit from this program. We should model the way for other groups, younger student athletes, and earn the respect of the governing bodies for the sport and all those we encounter. At all times we need to consider other persons and respect their rights and needs as well as expect they should respect ours. Let's keep ACUI & SCTP events a friendly place and help extend our respect and friendliness to everyone we encounter on the field, on campus, and in the world.
- **Be Knowledgeable**
 - o Know the contents of this match program, the ACUI & SCTP code of conduct, and NGB rules.
 - o Know and follow the Rules of Gun Safety
 - o Know your club or team officers, campus and ACUI & SCTP staff, as well as your home and host range personnel.
- **Enforce Safety Rules** – It is each community member's duty to ensure all members and guests obey all safety rules. Remember we are self-policing. Approach those who are not being safe and ask them to do so. Report rule infractions to the match director, range safety officer, and range host.
- **Report Range Damage/Abuse** – We have access to many beautiful and well-maintained ranges. Help us keep it that way. If you observe someone damaging or abusing the range or club property (including littering), ask the person to stop their actions. Report damage or abuse to the match director, range safety officer, and range host.
- **Be a Gun Safety Advocate** – Talk to people about safe shooting, responsible gun ownership, and support of shooting sports.

IMPORTANT INFORMATION FOR ALL CONFERENCE CHAMPIONSHIPS

It is the shooters' and coaches' responsibility to be familiar with all rules, guidelines, and information for each event. Please reference the 2026-27 season's rulebook, as well as ACUI & SCTP's 2026-27 Code of Conduct and Eligibility form for more details.

ELIGIBILITY & CODE OF CONDUCT

By registering for this competition, you agree that you meet the eligibility rules stated in ACUI & SCTP's rulebook and code of conduct/eligibility form, as well as agree to abide by the ACUI & SCTP Code of Conduct both on and off the range for the duration of the event. As a participant or coach, you are representing our sport and organizations. Please respect them. Providing an example of good conduct, appearance, and sportsmanship is paramount. Failure to follow the Code of Conduct will result in being deemed not eligible to compete per event management decision. The Code of Conduct and Eligibility form is available on ACUI's website.

REGISTRATION

Teams and athletes should create an account in SCTP's "SHOT" system prior to registration opening.

- Go to www.mysctp.com
- Select "coach login" at the top of the page
- On the next screen, choose "Register Team" (orange box)
- Follow the remaining instructions

You will not be able to squad your athletes if this is not done. During registration, individuals are asked to verify special accommodations, t-shirt size, shooting class, and more. If you are registering everyone for the team, it is helpful to register one person, note all the information needed, and then gather that information from the team before finishing your team registrations.

Please be sure to add the team leader, advisor, or coach as a "Coach's Registration" on the SHOT System. This person will have the ability to pre-build squads for their teams, add and remove students to and from the team's roster, and select squad spots for events.

Once you are registered in slots for an event, you can make adjustments to your record until the event is full or closed for final match production. If you need assistance making adjustments, please reach out to acuiclays@acui.ogr or to April Carr at april@mysctp.com.

There are multiple ways to make payment for event registration fees. Teams with an ACUI membership can pay for these fees with credit card through the SCTP SHOT systems, over the phone, or on site; with check mailed in to ACUI or turned in on site; or by PO. Teams without an ACUI membership can pay for these fees with credit card over the phone or on site; with check mailed in to ACUI or turned in on site; or by PO.

**If funds exceed the matching limit, matches will be pro-rated.*

CANCELLATIONS/REFUNDS

For regional events, registration changes can be made through the SHOT system by teams up until registration for an event closes. After this deadline, full fees may be charged for cancellations. If you would like to transfer your registration to someone else at no charge after registration for an event has closed, email acuiclays@acui.org. Include your name and the name and email address of the person to whom you'd like to transfer your registration.

AMERICAN EVENT SQUADDING

Squadding is available to teams upon registering for an event through SCTP's SHOT System. You can also pre-build your squads in the SHOT System to make squadding your team easier.

At most ranges, Sporting Clays and Super Sporting will be self-scored and will be a shotgun start at the posted time. Sporting Clays and Super Sporting will have squads of five shooters. At events where Sporting Clays and Super Sporting are self-scored, all squads must be made up of athletes from two or more teams (mixed-team squadding).

At most ranges, American Skeet and American Trap will be scored by impartial referees, and self-scoring is grounds for disqualification. These events will be shot in squads of five shooters. For American Skeet, a squad is welcome to self-pull if preferred. Per NSSA rules, "At the beginning of a round, with the permission of the chief referee or shoot management, a squad may self-pull while the assigned field referee continues to officiate and score" (NSSA Rule Book, IV-C-16). This statement is official permission per shoot management for a squad to request to self-pull, so long as the request is made at the beginning of a round.

If any skeet or trap event requires self-pulling or self-scoring in Skeet or Trap events due to labor shortages at the range, teams will be notified ahead of the event. At events where these disciplines are self-scored, all squads must be made up of athletes from two or more teams (mixed-team squadding).

The following are time allotments per event:

American Skeet 100 targets 1.5 hours	Doubles American Skeet 50 targets 1 hour
American Trap 100 targets 1 hour	Doubles American Trap 50 targets 30 min
Sporting Clays 100 targets 2.5-3 hours	Super Sporting 50 targets 2 hours

If a squad runs over the allotted time (providing there is no weather, mechanical, or other uncontrollable delays), the squad will be asked to leave the field to allow the next squaddled team to begin their rotation on time. Squads can resume and finish their rounds when/if an alternate field is available.

INTERNATIONAL EVENTS SQUADDING

Please note that not all squadding for international events will be done randomly by the ACUI & SCTP staff after the initial registration window closes for regional shoots. When random squadding is utilized, squads for registered shooters will be available on the SCTP SHOT System after the initial registration window closes. International events will be scored by impartial referees.

Shooters are allowed 30 minutes for each round of 25 targets. If a squad is over the allotted time by 10 minutes (providing there is no weather, mechanical, or other uncontrollable delays), the squad may be moved to an alternate field or moved to the end of the day to finish the round.

FIREARMS & AMMUNITION STORAGE

Limited firearm and ammunition storage might be available at the ranges. It is suggested that a team contact the individual ranges directly for availability of storage.

PRACTICE

Practice will be available throughout the duration of the competition wherever possible and during regular business hours at each range prior to the start of the competition. In cases in which all fields/courses will be used for the competition, practice may not be available. Please contact the ranges directly to inquire about practice.

AMMUNITION

Limited ammunition might be available for purchase at the ranges. It is suggested that a team member contact the individual ranges for availability of ammunition. Cost of practice and competition ammo is at the expense of the competitor. Ammunition up to 1 oz. is allowed for all international events. For American events, please check the appropriate NGB rules or match bulletin for allowable loads.

AWARDS

Individual awards will be presented to the top three individual men and the top three individual women in each discipline. Individual awards will also be presented to the top three individual men and the top three individual women in the Individual HOA and Individual CAA categories. Those eligible for the Individual HOA awards will not be eligible for the Individual CAA awards.

Team awards will be provided for the High Overall and Classic All Around categories, but not for each discipline (with the exception of International events) at events with less than 200 participants. Team awards in Trap, Skeet, and Sporting Clays will be added for events with 200 or more registered athletes.

Individual Classic All Around (CAA)

The individual awarded the Classic All Around will be determined by adding together total targets broken of the individual who shoots the three core American events (men's/women's) in American Trap, American Skeet, and Sporting Clays. At events where applicable, only individuals shooting less than the six American disciplines will be eligible to win this award.

Individual High Overall (HOA)

The individual awarded the High Overall will be determined by adding together the total targets broken of the individual who shoots all American events (men's/women's) in American Trap, American Trap Doubles, American Skeet, American Skeet Doubles, Sporting Clays, and Super Sporting.

Team High Overall (HOA) and Classic All Around (CAA)

Team HOA and CAA awards will be presented to the top three teams. The HOA and CAA teams are determined by taking the top five composite scores from individual qualified shooters and adding them together to get the top team in appropriate events. The team with the highest target count is the winner, second highest target count is second place, third highest target

count is third place. To qualify for team HOA or CAA, a team must have a minimum of five shooters (three for International), in each of the disciplines that make up a team award (as described below).

- Classic All Around: American Skeet, American Trap, Sporting Clays
- High Overall: American Skeet, Doubles American Skeet, American Trap, Doubles American Trap, Sporting Clays, Super Sporting
- International Skeet
- International Trap

At competitions in which Doubles Skeet, Doubles Trap, or Super Sporting is not offered, the High Overall will be adjusted to reflect all disciplines that are offered at the event (excluding the international disciplines). The CAA will remain made up of American Skeet, American Trap, and Sporting Clays.

Teams eligible for the team HOA award will not be eligible to receive a team CAA award.

There is a 15-minute review period after the final results are posted and the awards ceremony starts. Any correction to results for first through third place must be done during this review period. Once the award ceremony starts, the results are considered final.

TIES & SHOOT-OFFS

Ties for individuals in first, second, and third place will be shot off according to the posted rules below.

In a shoot off with two athletes, if one of the athletes is not present, the athlete present will receive the higher placement, with the athlete not present receiving the lower placement. In a shoot off with more than two athletes, if one of the athletes is not present, the remaining athletes will continue with the shoot off, with the athlete not present taking the lowest place. If more than one athlete is not present for the shoot off, the athlete present will receive the higher placement and the athletes not present will receive the next lowest placements as determined by long run.

If a tie cannot be broken by shoot off due to unforeseen circumstances, long runs with raw scores will be used to determine the individuals' placements. Any ties for special awards will be broken, time permitting. If time does not permit, they are broken by long runs from raw scores. If time does permit, the ACUI & SCTP shoot management staff will determine how the tie is broken. Individual ties in American Trap, American Skeet, Doubles American Trap, & Doubles American Skeet that are NOT for first, second, or third place will be broken by reverse run. Individual ties in Sporting Clays or Super Sporting that are NOT for first, second, or third place will be broken by randomly selected stations chosen prior to the start of the event.

International Trap and International Skeet – Participants will shoot off according to the National Governing Body rules dictated for breaking ties. Please note, a finals round will not be shot for the international events except at the ACUI & SCTP Collegiate Clay Targets International National Championships.

American Trap – Participants will first shoot a full round of 25. If there are still ties after the full round, they will shoot two targets per post. If still tied after the two per post, athletes will be moved back to the 21-yard line and shoot two targets per post. If still tied after the two per post at the 21-yard line, athletes will be moved back to the 25-yard line and shoot two targets per post. If still tied after two per post at the 25-yard line, athletes will shoot two per post miss-and-out from the 25-yard line until a winner is determined. At events with 200 or more registered athlete where team awards for American Trap are awarded, ties will be broken by combined reverse runs.

Doubles American Trap – Will be shot off as a ten-pair doubles event with two pairs from each post. If still tied following the ten-pair event, athletes will be moved back to the 21-yard line and shoot two pairs per post. If still tied after the two per post at the 21-yard line, athletes will be moved back to the 25-yard line and shoot two pairs per post. If still tied after two per post at the 25-yard line, athletes will shoot two per post miss-and-out from the 25-yard line until a winner is determined.

American Skeet and Doubles American Skeet – Will be shot off as doubles 3-4-5, miss-and-out. At events with 200 or more registered athletes where team awards for American Skeet are awarded, ties will be broken by combined reverse runs.

Sporting Clays/Super Sporting – Shoot-offs will be done at the range's 5-stand course. The shoot off will be 3-pair thrown from one station (as selected by event staff). If there is still a tie, 2-pair will be thrown from the next station. If there is still a tie, miss and out pairs will be thrown from the following stations until the tie is broken. If there is no 5-stand course at the range, then tied participants will shoot off from a selected course station, where 3-pair will be thrown, followed by miss and our pairs from the same station if there is still a tie. The shoot-offs will be held on targets or positions not previously shot by any participating competitor. Competitors will be randomly assigned shooting order by event staff. At events with 200 or more registered athletes where team awards for Sporting Clays are awarded, ties will be broken by randomly selected stations.

Team HOA and CAA Ties – For Team HOA and CAA team ties, each team will pick 1 athlete who has competed at the event to go head-to-head at the range's 5-stand course; the team-chosen participating athlete from each team will go head-to-head with the highest overall score determining the winner. If either of the above options are not available at the event, shoot management will randomly select Trap, Skeet, or Sporting Clays to be used as the shoot off determinate. This will be shot off according to the posted rules above. If more than two teams are tied for an HOA or CAA award, one team-chosen representative from each team will go head-to-head at the range's 5-stand course; the highest total score will determine the winner. In the event the range does not have a 5-stand course, shoot management will randomly select from Trap, Skeet, or Sporting Clays to be used as the shoot off determinate. This will be shot off according to the posted rules above.

Individual HOA & CAA Ties – For Individual HOA and CAA award ties, the two individuals tied will go head-to-head on the range's 5-stand course. The highest total score will determine the

winner. If the above options are not available at the event, shoot management will randomly select Trap, Skeet, or Sporting Clays to be used as the shoot off determinate. This will be shot off according to the posted rules above. If more than two individuals are tied for an HOA or CAA award, each individual will go head-to-head at the range's 5-stand course; the highest total score will determine the winner. In the event the range does not have a 5-stand course, shoot management will randomly select from Trap, Skeet, or Sporting Clays to be used as the shoot off determinate. This will be shot off according to the posted rules above.

If all parties involved in a tie are in agreement, ties may be broken using long run and/or the randomly selected sporting stations to break a tie in lieu of a shoot off. Shoot management reserves the right to adjust shoot off procedures at any time should it be deemed necessary.

Additionally, ACUI & SCTP are not responsible for travel expenses should an individual or team cancel or be disqualified due to health concerns or otherwise, or should an event be cancelled due to situations outside of our control.

Match program updates will be shared as soon as possible. Those already registered for an event that a match program update effects will be notified via email. Those of extreme importance and affecting more than one event will be shared in the ACUI Clays Newsletter, on the ACUI & SCTP websites, via email, and on social media channels.
